10a Reports by Assembly Members

Assembly Member McConachie reported that he went to DC with the hospital, and talked to Senators Begich and Murkowski and their staff. He attended the building committee meeting yesterday, which was very productive. The project is proceeding quite well.

Assembly Member Jack said he and Rooney testified on HB 184 Fisheries Tax HB184, which has gone to finance committee.

Mayor Maxand said he went to Ketchikan and met with the SEAPA board. The diesel protocol was on the agenda which they are working on. Staff is looking at other projects including raising the level of the Swan Lake Dam.

Paul Southland, TBPA Interim General Manager and John Jensen, TBPA Board President were present.

Moved by McConachie, seconded by Jack, to approve Thomas Bay Power Authority's FY2013 Non-Net Billable Budget, in the amount of \$55,000.

Paul Southland, 114 3rd, Interim General Manager, TBPA and *John Jensen*, Board President, said they would like to recognize Mayor Maxand as chairman of the SEAPA board. We are requesting the same budget amount as last year. It's important to support the organization. It's fortunate to find an original drawing of original Tyee plant. We will be presenting a copy to the City of Petersburg and City and Borough of Wrangell.

Assembly Member McConachie said his question on the budget is about travel costs; with the advent of internet, is there any way to set up teleconferences?

Southland said that is what the commission has done. They are proposing decrease for current year for this. We will be interviewing a new general manager and plant foreman this year.

Mayor Maxand said Mr. Southland has stepped in and filled in well, the morale and productivity is high, and communication is good. He has done an excellent job so far.

Borough Manager Rooney said we had a work session January 31st, and went through last year's list and removed items and added new projects and ranked projects. We presented the list to Senator Stedman last week, and he was concerned that the Boat Yard was not the #1 priority.

Assembly Member McConachie said Senator Bert Stedman has purse strings, and could make change orders to the downtown revitalization and boat yard projects.

Borough Manager Rooney said the Downtown Revitalization is first because of the delays, causing additional costs. That is DOT's problem. Identify money is needed, but no problem changing the order.

Assembly Member Privett said there is no reason to change this. We need to make sure the Downtown Revitalization Project is completed, or this will cause problems.

Mayor Maxand said some of these will be off of the list next year.

Borough Manager Rooney said Cassiar Street is already in the budget.

Motion approved unanimously by polled vote.
