Each year, the legislature has the duty of passing a budget. As a member of the legislature and a Finance Committee Majority member, I need input on what the budget should look like. This session, we will most likely have two options to balance our budget: making substantial budget cuts or using revenue that is currently earmarked for a full permanent fund dividend. Governor Dunleavy has chosen to predominantly close the deficit through budget cuts, which is outlined in his February 13th budget proposal:

- 1. 68.3% cut to the Alaska Marine Highway System
- 2. Complete elimination of the Senior Benefits Program
- 3. A plan to make Pioneer Home unaffordable to new entrants by removing state subsidies to the program
- 4. A 23% cut to the Foundation Formula (within the Department of Education and Early Development)
- 4. A complete elimination of Pre-K Grants, the Council of the Arts, WWAMI, OWL, Live Homework Help, and Public Radio funding

Governor Dunleavy also is in favor of a full dividend. PFDs

5. A \$1.64 million cut to commercial fisheries

and government services compete for funding; for every dollar used to pay the dividend, we have one less dollar to use for government services, such as education, the ferry system, and Pioneer Homes, and vice versa. It will cost \$1.6 billion to pay the full dividend for Fiscal Year 2020 and an additional 2.4 billion to pay back the past three capped dividends.
