# Mandate 10

## Interstate Travel



- ▶ All people arriving in Alaska, whether resident, worker or visitor, are **required to self-quarantine for 14 days**
- ▶ Travel Declarations must be submitted prior to or upon arrival
- ▶ If your business is designated as **Essential Services or Critical Infrastructure**, and your workers are traveling from outside of Alaska, the business must submit a plan outlining how you will avoid the spread of Covid-19 and not endanger the lives of the community.

# Mandate 15

## Services by Health Care Providers

Health Care facilities and providers can:

- ▶ provide low-risk, routine-type services which require minimal PPE
  - ▶ Examples: Chiropractors, Pharmacists, Optometrists, Veterinarians
- ▶ Resume surgeries and procedures (elective and urgent) if delay is deemed to cause significant impact on life, health, livelihood, or quality of life
  - ▶ Providers must meet certain conditions
  - ▶ May require the patient to obtain a Covid-19 test



# Mandate 16

## Reopen Alaska Responsibly Plan

- ▶ Seeks to balance the need to disrupt the rate of spread and the need to resume economic activity in a reasonable and safe manner
- ▶ 5 phases – we are currently in Phase 2
- ▶ Includes 18 attachments – each attachment lists the conditions under which certain activities, business or gatherings can occur
  - ▶ Examples: retail, restaurants, personal care services, fishing charters, gyms, lodging, social & religious gatherings, libraries, museums, swimming pools, bars, theaters, organized sports and licensed childcare

# Items addressed in the attachments



- ▶ Reservations or walk-ins
- ▶ Allowable Capacity and/or maximum number of individuals
- ▶ Table spacing
- ▶ Mitigation plan requirements
- ▶ Entryway Signage requirements
- ▶ Social distancing
- ▶ Cloth face coverings (for staff & patrons)
- ▶ Other required personal protective equipment (PPE)
- ▶ Cleaning protocols
- ▶ Employee screening

## Mandate 16 continued

### ▶ Common to most attachments:

- ▶ Social distancing of 6' minimum; more for singing or speaking loudly, or for table spacing in restaurants
- ▶ Cloth face coverings are strongly encouraged (required in personal care services)
- ▶ Employer must provide handwashing capability or hand sanitizer
- ▶ Hourly sanitization of frequently touched (touch-point) surfaces
- ▶ Requirement to develop a Covid-19 mitigation plan
- ▶ Requirement to conduct pre-shift screening of staff
- ▶ Requirement to clean & disinfect in compliance with CDC protocols





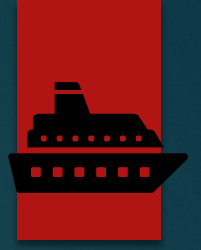
# Mandate 17

## Independent Fishing Vessels

- ▶ Applies to all catcher & tender vessels that have not agreed to operate under a fleet-wide plan submitted by a company, association, or entity that represents a fleet of vessels
- ▶ Does not apply to skiffs operating from shore, set netters or pot pullers
- ▶ Vessel captain must sign a form agreeing to comply with the protective plan outlined in Appendix 1
  - ▶ Includes: required documentation, travel procedures, self-quarantine protocol, screening of personnel, protecting the public, on board protective measures, and procedures for crewmembers who become ill

# Mandate 18

## Intrastate Travel



- ▶ Intrastate travel between communities located on the road system and/or the Marine Highway system is permitted for all purposes.
  - ▶ **Road system** = a community connected by road to the Seward, Parks, Klondike, Richardson, Sterling, Glenn, or Top of the World Highways
  - ▶ **Marine Highway System** = any community served by the Alaska Marine Highway System or the Inter-Island Ferry System
- ▶ Travelers may travel between the Road System and Marine Highway communities via any normal means of transportation including vehicle, boat, ferry, aircraft, and commercial air carrier.
