# Summary of Mitigation Plans

- ▶ Critical Infrastructure businesses are required to submit a Safety Mitigation Plan to the state for approval. (Mandate 10 Attachment A)
- ▶ Non-Essential businesses are required to have a Safety Mitigation Plan. The state does not require its review. (Mandate 16)
- ▶ Catcher and tender vessels fall under Mandate 17 and are not required to draft an independent plan for review.
- ▶ COVID safety information signage must be posted on fishing vessels and entryways/staff areas of non-essential services.
- ▶ Intrastate travel is referenced in Mandate 18. There are no updates to Mandate 10 for International or Interstate Travel at this time.

## Non-Essential Businesses

- ▶ Business Name and Contact
- ▶ Social Distancing
- ▶ Hygiene
- ▶ Staff and Operations
- ▶ Cleaning and Disinfecting
- ▶ Managing a Positive Case
- ▶ Other Considerations

## Critical Infrastructure/Essential

- ▶ Business Name and Contact
- ▶ Screening of Personnel
- ▶ Self Quarantine
- ▶ Protecting the Public
- ▶ Workplace Protective Measures
- ▶ Travel Plans and Procedures
- ▶ Procedures for Personnel (ill)
- ▶ Continued Operations



# Disinfectant Protocols

- ▶ Protect yourself, your staff and the public
- ▶ Disinfect; workstations, restrooms, entryways, touch points, person(s)
- ▶ Protective equipment; gloves, face coverings, gowns, face shields/masks and glasses
- ▶ Products; hydrochloric acid, chlorine, hydrogen peroxide
- ▶ Resources; CDC, EPA & OSHA



# Take action if an employee is suspected or confirmed to have COVID19 infection...

- ▶ Clean dirty surfaces with soap and water before disinfecting them.
- ▶ To disinfect surfaces, use products that meet EPA criteria for use against SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19, and are appropriate for the surface.
- ▶ Always wear gloves and gowns appropriate for the chemicals being used when you are cleaning and disinfecting.
- ▶ You may need to wear additional PPE depending on the setting and disinfectant product you are using. For each product you use, consult, and follow the manufacturer's instructions for use.
