The Patrol Division of the Wrangell Police Department is staffed by five personnel who are first responders to citizens' calls for assistance. Currently there are several patrol shifts providing a variety of services to the community 24 hours a day.

In addition to providing traditional law enforcement services, the patrol shifts focus on interacting with members of the community to discuss problem-solving techniques. The Police Department has been successful in this endeavor by providing presentations, to local groups schools, and organizations. Not only does this provide us an opportunity to keep the community informed, it also helps us to keep pace with the ever-changing needs of the community.

Department personnel are guided by the principals of community policing. Community policing is not a program, it is a philosophy of policing. We believe that policing the community should be a team effort between the Citizens and their Police Department. By partnering to identify and address problems as they arise, we become more effective.

Constant communication between the residents and their police is vital if community policing is to be successful. It is our belief that communications prompts commitment, commitment builds trust and trust encourages teamwork. Because of this belief we are able to openly discuss residents concerns and find appropriate ways to address them.

During 2018 the police department responded to 2150 calls for service and filed 88 criminal cases.

We have seen a complete turnover of the patrol staff over the last two years with retirements and moving on to bigger and better things. The Hiring process has been challenging to say the least; we have been able to locate and hire personnel for those positions and should be at full staff in February.

I will have one officer in the three week recertification academy the end of January into the first part of February, one Recruit will be attending the basic academy February through June. At this point I anticipate having another officer for the recertification academy next January.

If all goes well by July we will have full working staff.

Corrections / Dispatch Unit

The Correctional / Dispatch staff operate the correctional facility and provide emergency and routine dispatch services 365 days a year 24 hour per day.

During 2018 the Wrangell Correctional Center held 103 prisoners who served 390 man days.

Each of the correctional officers has completed the required Department of Corrections training. They received additional training this year for the use of electronic monitoring by the DOC for pretrial monitoring and enforcement. All Correctional staff currently meets or exceeds D.O.C. Standards of training A Updating of the corrections/ dispatch Center policies and procedures manual was completed with the help of a grant from DH&EMS.

Department of Motor Vehicles

We continue to provide contract services for the Department of Motor Vehicles. We are able to provide Registration and Licensing for vehicles, and driving tests for Class D and Motorcycles in addition to renewal services for all classes of driver's license.

Services are also provided for the federal TWIC program and TSA Programs

There were 2039 transactions in 2018 with \$ 72,650 remitted to the State and \$35,419 retained by the borough.




Crimes Against Person 2018




Crimes Against Property 2018






Offenses Against Public Order 2018




