The Patrol Division of the Wrangell Police Department is staffed by five well trained personnel who are first responders to citizens' calls for assistance. Currently there are several patrol shifts providing a variety of services to the community 24 hours a day.

In addition to providing traditional law enforcement services, the patrol shifts focus on interacting with members of the community to discuss problem-solving techniques. The Police Department has been very successful in this endeavor by providing countless presentations, to local groups schools, and organizations. Not only does this provide us an opportunity to keep the community informed, it also helps us to keep pace with the ever-changing needs of the community.

Department personnel are guided by the principals of community policing. Community Policing is not a program, it is a philosophy of policing. We believe that policing the community should be a team effort between the Citizens and their Police Department. By partnering to identify and address problems as they arise, we become more effective.

Constant communication between the residents and their police is vital if community policing is to be successful. It is our belief that communications prompts commitment, commitment builds trust and trust encourages teamwork. Because of this belief we are able to openly discuss residents concerns and find appropriate ways to address them.

During 2011 the police department responded to 2627 calls for service and filed 154 criminal cases.

### Corrections / Dispatch Unit

The Correctional / Dispatch staff operate the correctional facility and provide emergency and routine dispatch services 365 days a year 24 hour per day.

During 2011 the Wrangell Correctional Center held 184 prisoners who served 1870 man days. 38 of the inmates were female and 146 were male. No juveniles were held in the facility however two were held outside the facility in accordance with our non-secure juvenile holding grant.

All of the correctional officers except Karen Lockabe our newest corrections officer, have completed the required Department of Corrections training. All Correctional staff currently meets or exceeds D.O.C. Standards of training

One area of concern is with the current E911 system is that as of January 2012 the company that provided the system will no longer provide support for the current system. The obsolete portion of the system is the part that provides the information on where the call originates from. The current system cost was about \$95,000 I have not yet been able to come up with a price on an equivalent system.

### Department of Motor Vehicles

During the 2011 year the Wrangell DMV completed 2298 licenses registrations and other documentation for the state of Alaska DMV this activity generated \$67,379.00 of revenue for the state an \$33,653.90 for the Wrangell Borough. We have in addition to our previous services, also started offering Haz Mat fingerprinting and CDL road testing.

### YOUTH PROGRAMS

### Wrangell Youth Court Dorthea Rooney

The goal of the Wrangell Youth Court program is to promote public safety by encouraging accountability for acts of juvenile delinquency. The WYC will provide the opportunity to help address the teens crimes at the beginning of the continuum, providing for a timely and appropriate response to nonviolent first and second time offenders, thus reducing the likelihood of their penetrating further into the juvenile justice system.

The WYC had only four cases in 2011.

### a. Strategies for Service Delivery

The WYC is composed of three peer judges that determine the sentencing requirements for the respondent. The respondent is usually given community service hours, an essay, fee to enter WYC, letter of apology when appropriate, restitution when needed, and any other creative sentencing ideas mandated by the tribunal. WYC receives cases from the Wrangell Trial Court, Wrangell Police Department and parents. This year we have had several referrals from Jan East Juvenile Probation Officer.

### b. Target Population and Service Area

Service delivery will target youth 18 and under in the Wrangell Borough, and the delivery of services will involve youth 18 and younger in developing and implementing the youth court.

During 2011 Wrangell Youth Court has retained eight active members. The members take part in community activities such as the Wrangell Health Fair and Wrangell's Annual Bike Rodeo.

In 2011 Wrangell Youth Court processed four cases and put on three mock trials. The Wrangell Youth Director, Dorthea Rooney traveled to Juneau for the UYCA Director's annual meeting.

### E911 Funding

I am currently seeking funding to replace the equipment that supplies the location data to the dispatch center. The funding for these systems has become much sparser in the Past few years.

### Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) \$7,500

The Wrangell Police Department met all of the requirements of the Emergency Management Performance Grant. This grant supports 50/50 with the City of Wrangell by non-federal hard match funds by including the Chief of Police Wages as manager.

A full scale exercise with DOT EMS and Fire department was held during May. The exercise scenario involved a commercial aircraft breaking up at the end of the runway with causalities on the beach and in the water.


















Five Year Comparison 2007-2011 Alcohol Offenses




Five Year Comparison 2007-2011 Animals




Five Year Comparison 2007-2011 City Violations




Five Year Comparison 2006-2010 Miscellaneous Activity




Five Year Comparison 2007-2011 Miscellaneous Offenses




Five Year Comparison 2007-2011 Crimes Against Person
