- No meat or meat products (bones, etc.), breads or potatoes.
- No weeds, grass or glossy paper.


## Community Projects!

If you have a community clean-up project, you may contact Wrangell Public Works to see if your project qualifies for free plastic bags. These are specifically NOT for regular household waste, rather community-oriented projects.

Zaks Restaurant has some containers available for reuse, such as egg cartons, plastic jugs, etc. Selection varies week to week. Help yourself!

## COMMUMTY COMPOST

Step 1. Collect fruits, veggies, coffee grounds, shredded newspaper, eggs, ect. (no meat/meat product, breads or_potatoes) in a reusable container.

## Step 2. Add food scraps/paper to the compost bin labeled "Add".

Step 3. Cover food scraps with three of your container's worth of browns

## Step 4. Secure Lid!



During the Fall of 2019, Wrangell Cooperative Association IGAP staff completed a waste characterization study. Approximately 1,700 lbs of trash was surveyed and $40 \%$ of the trash could be composted (food scraps and paper products).

For 2018, Wrangell paid $\$ 219,852.44$ (more than any year since 2013) to ship $1,581.75$ TONS of trash down to a WA landfill. "By weight, the largest contributing waste category that is transshipped is food waste at $33 \%$ of the overall poundage for the week," (Wrangell Integrated Solid Waste Mgmt Plan, 2020).

Wrangell is full of very resourceful, skilled and motivated community members; we can work together to shrink the amount of waste that we pay to have shipped down to Washington.
