

Wrangell Area Trails

City & Borough of Wrangell Trails:

Mt. Dewey: 0.25 boardwalk trail leads to top of Mt. Dewey and provides views of town.

Volunteer Park Nature Loops: 1 mile and 0.5 mile loop trails leads through forest and muskeg habitat. Trail is gravel-surfaced and has interpretive signage.

Eastern Passage Paddle Craft Trail: This 250 ft long, six ft wide gravel path provides access to portage paddle craft from the Spur Road down to the Eastern Passage (Back Channel).

Forest Service Wrangell Island Trails:

Rainbow Falls Trail: 0.7 mile boardwalk trail leads from Zimovia Highway to observation sites of Rainbow Falls.

Institute Creek Trail: Boardwalk trail begins at 0.6 mile from Rainbow Falls Trailhead and continues 2.7 miles to Shoemaker Bay Overlook shelter.

North Wrangell Trail: This trail starts from either Spur Road or at a junction off the Institute Creek Trail, 2.2 miles from Rainbow Falls Trailhead. Trail is about 4 miles long and provides access to the High Country Shelter and Pond Shelter along the way.

Long Lake Trail: 0.6 mile boardwalk trail leads from Forest Road 6271 to Long Lake & Shelter.

Nemo Saltwater Access Trail: 0.5 mile boardwalk trail leads from Nemo Loop Road to Turn Island Campsite, adjacent to the beach.

Salamander Ridge Trail: 1 mile trail leads from Forest Road 50050 to subalpine. First 500 feet is boardwalk; no surfacing thereafter.

Thoms Lake Trail: 1.4 mile gravel-surfaced trail leads from Nemo Loop Road to the shore of Thoms Lake.

Forest Service Trails Off Wrangell Island:

Aaron Creek Trail: Mainland; 4 mile trail connects Berg Bay to the mouth of Berg Creek. First .4 mile of trail from Berg Bay Cabin to grass flats is boardwalk; balance of trail is unsurfaced.

Kunk Lake Trail: Etolin Island; 1.3 mile trail from Zimovia Strait to Kunk Lake & Shelter. Trail is partially surfaced with boardwalk.

Mill Creek Trail: Mainland; 0.9 mile trail connects beach at Back Channel to Virginia Lake outlet.

Anan Creek Trail: Mainland (not on map); 0.5 mile boardwalk and gravel trail provides access from the mouth of Anan Creek to the Anan Wildlife Observatory.

Mallard Slough Trail: Mainland (not on map); 2.7 mile trail starts at Mallard Slough Cabin and goes to Cheliped Bay. The first 0.5 mile is maintained; marshy afterwards.
